- Please don't feed birds and squirrels. Doing so leads to rodent problems and leaves an unhealthy mess.

Spring Apartment Maintenance

All air conditioners must be removed and installed by our maintenance department. Please call 212-677-5744 to set up an appointment. If you're considering buying a new air conditioner check the Energy Star rating to make sure it's energy efficient.

If you haven't had your apartment painted in at least 3 years, you may do so and get a credit from the management office. Make an appointment with the office for an inspection beforehand to make sure you're eligible. Studio apartment credit is \$400; 1 bedroom, \$500; 2 bedroom, \$650; 3 bedroom, \$800. Make sure you keep the receipts from your professional painter and call the office again for an inspection at the completion of the paint job.

Pest control services are also available through the maintenance office (212 677-5744). You can make an appointment for the exterminator on Tuesday mornings from 8 am - 12 pm or Wednesday afternoons from 3 pm - 6 pm.

Gardeners, please remember window boxes must hang on the *inside* of balconies.

TENNIS ANYONE?

There are 12 tennis courts in East River Park at Broome St. (park supervisor 212-529-7185) You have to have a permit to play. You can pay \$7 for a single session or get a season pass at \$100 for adults, \$20 for seniors (62 and over), and \$10 for juniors (17 and under). You can buy the pass in person at Paragon Sports, Broadway at 18th Street or at the Arsenal at 64th and Fifth Ave. Download a permit form from www.nyc.gov/parks or call 212 360-8131 for more information.

SWIMMING POOLS

The Hamilton Fish Olympic size outdoor pool at Pitt and Houston Streets is free. 212 387-7687.

So is the slightly smaller Asser Levy outdoor pool at Asser Levy Place and East 23rd Street 212 447-2020. And so is the smaller yet Dry Dock outdoor pool at East 10th St. between Avenues C & D. 212 677-4481. The city offer free swimming programs for tots, children, teens and adults. Project Green Light

If every American home replaced just one light bulb with a compact fluorescent bulb, we would save enough energy to light more than 2.5 million homes for a year and prevent greenhouse gases equivalent to the emissions of nearly 800,000 cars. East River Coop already uses these bulbs in all of our hallways. While they are initially more expensive than incandescent bulbs they save a great deal of money in the long run by using 2/3 less energy and last up to 10 times longer. So go green!

Welcome Whole Foods
