SPURRING DEVELOPMENT

Plans for the Seward Park Urban Renewal Area are beginning to take shape:

- The development will encompass 1.65 million square feet on nine parcels.
- It will be a mixed-use project (40% commercial and 60% residential). There could be up to 100,000 square feet for community uses (medical centers, cultural facilities, etc.) Most buildings will include both

residential and commercial. Among the commercial uses under consideration are a movie theater, a hotel, and a relocated and enlarged Essex Street Market.

■ There are expected to be 900 residential units, half of which will be affordable housing.

A WORLD CLASS EDUCATION

A uniquely new, internationally-focused private school has opened along the M-21 and M-14 bus lines at 2nd Street and Second Avenue. The World Class Learning Academy (www.wclacademy.org) offers children aged 2-11 a high-quality, international education aimed at preparing students to meet the growing challenges of a rapidly changing world. Students benefit from an academic program based on a unique combination of the International Primary Curriculum, the National Curriculum for England and Wales, and the highly respected International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme. Several East River residents have already enrolled at the school, which occupies the former site of the La Salle Academy.

REDISTRICTING

As a result of a complex redistricting process following the 2010 Census, All of East River Cooperative will be in Representative Nydia Velazquez' district, while Sheldon Silver and Daniel Squadron will continue to be our Assemblyman and State Senator starting in January, provided they are re-elected. City Council district lines are still being redrawn.

MAKING A POINT

Local Law 11 requires repair work to be done on East River's brickwork every 10 to 15 years. Scaffolding will be required for each building being repaired. You will not need to remove your air conditioner, and blinds and curtains should be closed if you have privacy concerns. The work is scheduled to begin soon and should be completed by December 2012.
